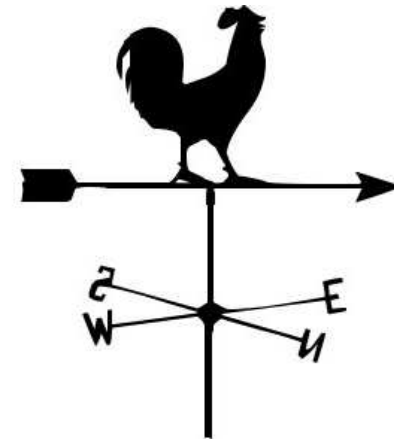
A thermometer measures the temperature.

A wind vane shows where the Wind is coming from.

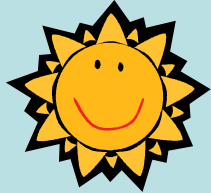
